



RECAP

2016 Construction began the week of April 11. The remaining projects include the city-wide rehabilitation affecting over 70 blocks of the city infrastructure, pedestrian access ramp improvements to five of the intersections on Main Street, reconstruction of Renville County Road 34 (Ash Avenue W.), a water treatment plant project (complete), renovations at the Wastewater Treatment Plant east of town and replacement of the old water tower.

The busyness of construction season carries on this year for the City of Hector. Four of the five significant contracts are still underway.

The City Wide Rehabilitation Project is focusing on the neighborhoods south of the railroad and east of Main. Work is starting on the northerly areas and progressing toward the south.

The weather conditions play a substantial role in progress and scheduling, so providing a specific schedule is difficult. Please note that other types of work such as the directional drilling and pipe bursting may take place at various times and places.

The intersection of Cedar Ave. and Main St. will also receive the new MnDOT ADA improvements to make the intersection fully accessible to individuals with disabilities. This intersection will be more complicated than the other four since we'll replace underlying utilities first. This will

require close coordination between the contractors. This project is not expected to start until June.

Ash Avenue will see the final course of asphalt applied this year, however, paving conditions are still a couple months away.

The Wastewater Treatment Plant is now over 80 percent complete and remains on schedule for completion later in 2016.

The foundation for the water tower replacement is now in place. The tower components have been delivered to the site for assembly. A specific date for erection of the tower will be dependent upon site conditions and weather. Painting will not take place until warmer weather.

Again, we thank you for your continued patience and understanding as we continue upgrading the infrastructure and prepare for the city's future.
